- Rev. Laura is bringing fresh ideas and new energy to UUCR and has been providing engaging Sunday Services with thought-provoking and inspiring sermons. Her contract has now been extended through June 2025 and her hours increased from ¾ time to full-time. Yay!
- More people are attending church in person, and our dedicated Tech Team continues to provide both live and pre-recorded online options for those that are not yet able to join us in the sanctuary.
- We have had a number of new families and individuals join us on Sundays.
- The Christmas services were amazing, complete with the return of the Living Nativity Pageant, luminarias, and the Hallelujah Chorus. The pews were packed on Christmas Eve!
- A successful Kris Kringle Fair last fall and plans for an in-person Starlight Soiree Auction in March.
- We have a new Office Administrator, Donna Gargiulo.
- Our dedicated Property Committee is working year-round taking care of our beautiful campus.
- Our largest EVER Share the Plate collection during the month of December to enable our Bread and Roses team to provide a monthly meal for the vulnerable populations of Lawrence.

- A vibrant K-6 RE program, plus Building Bridges, Our Whole Lives, and Coming of Age programs for the older kids.
- Living our commitment to Help Heal the World through Social Justice activities, Undecorate the Tree, the PFLAG Support Group, Green Sanctuary, Share the Plate, the relaunch of the Welcoming Congregation Committee, and more!

• The creation of the "CommUUnity Collaborative", a new adult religious education program for UUs across the state, developed by Rev. Laura and colleagues from area churches.

Our Goal: \$385,000

During our most recent Strategic Planning process, the congregation expressed a strong desire for the church to achieve financial stability. **Your pledge will help make that happen!**

Our goal this year is to have the participation of ALL our members and friends, and to raise \$385,000.

We are on track to have a balanced budget this year for the first time in several years. And we are doing it without any COVID relief funds and without touching the very limited reserves that we have left. And now we want to keep that momentum going!

The Finance Council has developed a preliminary FY24 budget. In order to balance it we need to raise \$385K in pledges. It's a real stretch, but reaching that goal is essential to getting our finances back on a solid footing.

Here's What We Ask:

- If you are already pledging, please thoughtfully consider increasing your pledge by 10%-20% percent or more to help keep us moving forward. If that is not possible for you, please consider an incremental 3-5% increase. For a \$2,000 pledge, that would be an increase of \$60-\$100 per year, or just \$5 to \$10 per month.
- If you haven't started pledging yet, now would be a great time to begin! Knowing how much you
 plan to contribute during the coming year helps us plan responsibly for the future. So please pick
 an amount that works for your budget and make a pledge! For more information about pledging
